

ACHACHAIRU

Achachairu (*Garcinia humilis*) is a shrub (various species) that grows only in Eastern part of Bolivia (zone of Porongo, La Guardia, El Torno, Saavedra, Montero, Buenavista, San Pedro, Guarayos and San Javier).

The fruit of this shrub is a drupe two seeds with mesocarp white, sweet-taste sour (delicious) and skin fruit is yellow.



Depending on the size and weight, the fruits of achachairu were classified into 12 types, which in turn were grouped into large, medium and small. The fruit of achachairu keeps well for four to six weeks as long as it stays out of the fridge. Fruits of achachairu used to prepare juices, sodas, ice cream, wine (from skin fruit), oil (extracted from seeds) preserves and other products. The benefits of this fruit suggest that in some years, could become a fruit for export.
