SOME GOODS FROM BOLIVIA WITH EXPORT POTENTIAL.

Study of foreign markets for export of goods from Bolivia: USA, Canada, Australia, Brazil, Chile, Panama, India, Iran, Austria, Belgium, Sweden, Denmark, Netherlands, UK, Spain, France, Germany and other countries. Study of foreign markets for export of bamboo, bananas, cocoa, coffee, meat and leather of crocodiles,

exotic meats and leathers, natural colorants, lemons, maca, palm hearts, papaya, pineapples, quinoa, vines, minerals, soybeans, woods and other products.

Arichote or urucu. Arichote or urucú is used in various segments of the food industry.

Achachairú and copoasu. Countries interested in importing achachairú and copoasú are USA, Germany, France, Italy, Australia, Japan, Russia and China.

Amaranto (kiwuicha). The seeds are eaten as a cereal grain. They are black in the wild plant, and white in the domesticated form.

Banana. The main importing countries of bananas (fresh or dry) from Bolivia were Argentina and Chile.

Brazil nut. Bolivia is a major exporting country of Brazil nuts (approximate 58.7% of total world exports).

Bolivianita stone. Bolivianita natural stone that can only be found in Bolivia. Much appreciated by the rare combination of colors.

Cocoa. The main importing countries of cocoa from Bolivia were Switzerland, Germany and Italy.

Coffee. Coffee production in Bolivia is concentrated in the rural areas of the Yungas, where approximately 90 % cultivation occurs. Other growing regions include Santa Cruz, Beni, Cochabamba, Tarija, and Pando.

Camu-camu. Camu-camu is a low-growing shrub found throughout the Amazon rainforest, mainly in swampy or flooded areas. It grows to a height of about 2-3 m and has large, feathery leaves.

Coca colla - bolivian energy drink. Coca Colla is an invigorating and refreshing beverage made of coca leaf extract.

Coca leaf products. Coca tea; Coca liquor; Coca firewater; Slimming coca syrup; Anti-diabetic coca syrup; Anti-rheumatic coca syrup; Coca syrup cough and asthma; Coca syrup liver and kidney; Coca syrup high pressure; Coca syrup prostate; Coca syrup nerves; Coca syrup for ulcers; Kidney coca syrup ; Coca tonic syrup; Coca power; Coca candies and chewing-gums; Coca leaf extract.

Culinary spices. The main spices are chili pepper, black pepper, paprika, cinnamon and cinnamon-tree flowers, cloves, anise, cumin, turmeric, bay leaves, oregano, saffron.

Crocodile meat. The main Crocodile meat importers are Hong Kong and China.

Crocodile leather. The main worldwide importer of crocodile skins is Italy.

Chia. Chia is an annual herb growing up to 1 m tall, with opposite leaves that are 4-8 cm long and 3-5 cm wide. Its flowers are purple or white and are produced in numerous clusters in a spike at the end of each stem. Chia is grown commercially for its seed, a food that is rich in omega-3 fatty acids.

Herbal medicine. Ajenjo, Albahaca, Alcachofa, Ambay, Anís estrella, Artemiza, Boldo, Borraja, Carqueja, Cascara sagrada, Cedrón, Cola de caballo, Cola de quirquincho, Congorosa, Cuasia amarga, Cuatro cantos, Diente de león, Ginkgo biloba, Hamamelis, Hinojo, Llantén, Muérdago, Nogal, Pasionaria, Pezuña de vaca, Poleo, Pulmonaria, Romero, Salvia blanca, Sauco, Lapacho, Uña de gato, Uva ursi, Vira blanca, Yerba de la piedra

Leather. Cow leather (wet blue), lama leather (wet blue), sheep leather (wet blue), leather for manufacture of clothing (nappa), chamois leather for garment.

Maca. Maca is exported in tubers in powder and capsules. Thanks to trends in natural medicine exports of maca from Bolivia to the U.S. and Europe is constantly growing.

Mango. The main importing country of mango, purple mangosteen and guavas from Bolivia are Mexico, Netherlands, Brazil, Peru, Thailand, Philippines, Ecuador and Egypt.

Organic products. Stevia extract powder, liquid stevia, stevia leaves; Maca chocolate candies; Quinoa real flakes; Organic amaranth flakes; Beverage with organic amaranth; Popcorn of cañawa; Organic granola; Six energetic power bars with organic cereals; Beverage of organic, purple api; Organic linseed beverage.

Palm heart. The main importing countries of palm heart from Bolivia are Argentina.

Pineapple. The main importing countries of pineapple (fresh, canned or dry) from Bolivia were Argentina and Chile.

Quinoa. Bolivia is a major country in the world supplier of quinoa (approximate 42%). The main buyers of Bolivian quinoa are Peru and Japan.

SOYBEANS and SUNFLOWER. Soybean oil, sunflower oil, soybeans, soybean meal in the form of pellets, sunflower meal.

Tarwi. The bone-white seed contains more than 40% protein and 20% fat and has been used as a food by Andean people since ancient times, especially in soups, stews, salads and by itself mixed with boiled maize.

Tropical wood. Species of trees in Bolivia. Names of trees, which grow in Bolivia: Chrysophyllum ponocarpum, Galesia integrifolia, Pterogyne nitens, Prosopis chilensis, Pterogyne nitens, Prosopis chilensis, Alnus acuminata, Dipteryx odorata, Simarouba amara, Aspidosperma australe, Spondias mombin, Ochroma lagopus, Sloanea obtusifolia, Qualea paraensis.
